

## **NOTES on PDF files included in the DVD**

All the PDF files included in the DVD have been converted from the original Microsoft Office Word 2003 PhD thesis file into the respected PDF files with the Adobe Acrobat X Pro (version 10.1.1) software.

In order to make the PhD thesis as coherent and useful as possible, there are many links embedded in the Word 2003 thesis file, referring the reader either to Internet based web sites, or relevant links within the thesis. That allows the reader to cross reference, have more detailed explanations or examples for a relevant topic or section of the thesis.

While the links work in the Word file of the PhD thesis, Adobe Acrobat X Pro is NOT able to convert all the links in the proper and correct fashion. Thus, e.g. end note links included in the thesis, intended to refer the reader to a more detailed explanation or an example etc. in the end note chapter, often do not lead the reader to the intended section. Further, while the included web site links in the end notes are linked correctly, the links embedded within the end notes, referring to other chapters, explanations or examples within the thesis, are NOT correctly linked. These errors are not a mistake by the author, but are due to some Adobe Acrobat X Pro software bugs, which have not yet been recognised or fixed by the software developers in the latest Adobe Acrobat X Pro software packet.

Further, while all the links are included in the individual PDF files of each chapter of the PhD thesis, the links referring to other chapters in the thesis can not work, as each PDF file chapter represents an individual file.

Thus, if a reader is interested to use and refer frequently to the links in the PhD thesis, the author suggests to open and read the PhD thesis in the “Full PhD Thesis” Word 2003 file, with the links active and referring the reader to the correct linked web sites or thesis internal text references.

The author requests your understanding and hopes that the PhD thesis provides the intended stimulus and information for any one interested to work in the field of applied renewable energy technologies and holistic community development.
